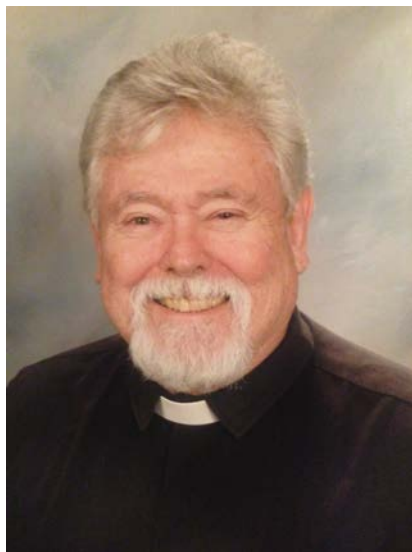

TICCS is a research and teaching institute in Tamale, northern Ghana, which offers programs in language-learning, cross-cultural training and cultural analysis for cross-cultural and intercultural ministry. Its staff conduct research in areas of culture, and, through special training courses, seminars, workshops and

publications aimed at informing a wider public, it fosters culturally appropriate Christian ministry and human development.
